

Winter Midweek League Rules 2026/27

1. This competition is open to LTA registered venues within Middlesex who have also “opted in” to membership of Middlesex Tennis. The competition will be run in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the LTA and LTA code of conduct.

The competition will be held annually between September and April. The season ends at the end of April at the latest, but matches should initially all be organised by the end of March.

2. The league will be organised into divisions, geographically where possible, apart from top division.

3. Teams will play one match against each of the other teams in their division.

Players

4. Teams will comprise 2 men and 2 ladies eligible to represent the club as specified in the regulations for the Middlesex Cup Inter-Club Championships and meeting the age limits:

Men and Ladies to be 55 years by December 31 2027.

ALL players MUST be affiliated to the LTA.

5. Where clubs enter more than one team, different players should be used in each.

Where a Club has 2 teams in the same division, they should play each other by the end of October.

A player who plays twice for a higher team may NOT play for a lower team during that season.

Match Format

6. Matches will comprise of 4 rubbers, being:

1 Men's Doubles

1 Ladies' Doubles

2 Mixed Doubles, the stronger pair must play as 1st couple.

7. Each rubber will comprise of 2 tie-break sets.

Each set won will score two points, and match results will be determined by the total number of points won.

It is important that all rubbers are played or a complete result cannot be achieved.

Where a match is not played, the club conceding will score zero points, the club taking the walk-over will be awarded a proportionate number of points depending on their other results.

Courts

8. Matches must be played on 2 courts of similar surface, outdoors. Indoor or under lights

Scheduling Matches

9. It is the responsibility of the home team to arrange the dates and times of matches.

A choice of three realistic dates must be offered by the home side, one of which must be accepted by the away team.

Matches should be played Monday to Friday, with a start time between 10am-2pm, unless both teams agree otherwise.

All arrangements must be made by Mid-September.

Responsibility for making contact to arrange the match is not exclusive and away teams will be expected to take over the arrangements if the deadline is missed.

All fixture dates MUST be entered into the LTA website.

Matches should not be postponed due to lack of players.

Match Arrangements

10. The captains should confirm the arrangements about 5 days before a match with the opposing captain.

11. At least 2 new sets of LTA approved balls must be provided by the home team.

Incomplete Matches

12. If a match is not completed due to adverse conditions, it should be re-arranged for another date.

It should ONLY be re-commenced from the point at which play ceased if both clubs are fielding the same team.

Captains may waive this rule, but only by mutual agreement. The league organiser MUST be notified of re-arrangements.

Match Results

13. Results are to be entered on the Tournament Software web site by the winning captain within 2 days of the match being played and confirmed on the web site by the losing captain within 7 days.

In the case of a draw, the home captain must ensure the result has been entered.

Divisional Standings

14. The winner of each division will be the team which has achieved the highest total of points in the matches played.

Where there is a tie, the percentage of games actually played and won, to the total number played will decide the league position.

15. The winner of Division 1 will be declared the champion club.

In each division, normally there will be two promotions and two relegations per season. Where there are two divisions below a single division, then, generally only one team will be promoted.

Where new teams enter, their position will be decided by the Tournament Committee.

Teams conceding more than one match are likely to be relegated.

16. The Competition Organiser's decision on all matters is final.
